#### "PASTOR TOM'S TOP 10 LIST OF THINGS TO DO WITH YOUR NOSE DURING THE HEALTH CRISIS"

March 21, 2020 Sermon

NUMBER 10: LOOK DOWN ON IT AT SOMEBODY: Has your pride reared its ugly head this past week? Were you one of those folks hoarding toilet paper, instant hand-sanitizer, or Clorox wipes? There has been such fear and ugliness from many people – Jesus would tell us it's time to be more loving – more generous – more kind: Remember, E.G.O. – Means "Easing God Out" – Pray for God to remove your prideful ego and replace it with love and kindness:

NUMBER 9: POKE IT INTO SOMEBODY'S ELSE'S BUSINESS: We see the dissention and strife happening in our country – Congress is divided along party-lines....We're on the edge of a financial depression – And people want to poke their nose in your business to see if they can get a reaction from you....Remember, it takes 2 to tango – You don't have to participate – Default to love!

NUMBER 8: SNOOP AROUND WITH IT: I used to love to gossip.....to nose around in other people's lives – Then tell everybody half-truths or rumors about people to see what kind of reaction I could get.....Remember, God gave us 2 ears and 1 mouth for a reason! Try to listen twice as much as you speak, and remain humble and modest in God's eye:

NUMER 7: GET IT OUT OF JOINT: Anger is a normal human emotion – It's going to happen to us – But, the key is what we do with this anger, how do we process it – Many people let anger fuel their adrenaline until it becomes an obsession – And the tongue is a dangerous weapon when we're angry. We say things we don't mean, and then regret them. Realize that anger is a natural emotion, but then hand it off to God, and let God have it and deal with it.....Don't let yourself become obsessed with anger because misery is sure to follow:

NUMBER 6: CUT IT OFF TO SPITE YOUR FACE: I noticed yesterday that I was bitter and jealous because I haven't been able to buy any toilet paper at the grocery store – How dare those hoarders who bought every last scrap of toilet paper, so I couldn't have any! I have a feeling of self-righteous indignation.....that I'm not being treated fairly – People are so rude and insensitive.....And I need to realize that my fears of not having material things is just an illusion – Groceries and necessities will be replenished – This is a temporary situation – My fears are driving my imagination.....Deep breaths help to promote calmness – Trust in the name of the Lord!

NUMBER 5: PAY THROUGH IT: It's a time of the haves vs the have-nots, and I feel like I'm one of the half-nots.....I covet material things other people have, and feel less than: I have to realize the material things in this world are temporary....We must concentrate on eternal things – Remember, the Bible tells us to not get too comfortable here in this world, as it's a temporary home.....This is not our eternal-home.....we're just passing through this world.....We must focus on a relationship with Jesus Christ – Who died on the cross so we could have eternal-life. ## **"PASTOR TOM'S TOP 10 LIST OF THINGS TO DO WITH YOUR NOSE DURING THE HEALTH CRISIS"**

**NUMBER 4: FIND SOMETHING RIGHT UNDER IT:** When I relax and come into quiet reflection with God, I realize how blessed we really are – We have the love of Christ which transcends all understanding – We have salvation, given freely to us through our Lord Jesus Christ.....We've found it and it's time to share it – Don't be afraid to tell others how you found it – Jesus Christ is ready and willing to share his love of salvation – Be a willing messenger!

**NUMBER 3: SEE PAST IT:** Look past the temporal things of life – The things of self – Ego – Pride – Concentrate on our purpose here – To love our God with all our hearts, mind, and souls.....and to love others as we love ourselves. Be a hope-spreader.....Spread the message of God's love for us which gives us hope, and remember hope is grounded through our Lord Jesus Christ!

**NUMBER 2: KEEP IT CLEAN:** I need to be more humble and more obedient – The word humility literally means, "Having a low estimate of yourself – But it doesn't imply self-deprecation.....No, being humble is not to stoop until you're smaller than yourself.....Rather, start at your full height before some higher-power shows you just how small your greatness really is....."Walk humbly with God" – This is the site of true humility – Walking with God lets us in on his greatness so we can see just how little we truly are: Pray to be clothed in humility so we're willing to serve others like our Lord Jesus Christ.

**NUMBER 1: AND THE NUMBER ONE THING TO DO WITH YOUR NOSE WHEN YOU'RE BORED DURING OUR HEALTH CRISIS: GET IT STUCK IN THE BOOK:** Get your nose stuck in the Book – The Bible – During this time of social isolation, the Bible is a welcome friend – It gives us such hope, refuge, and serenity! Reach for your Bible! Search for the strength in God's word – Our faith will overcome our fear – Our love will overcome hate – The word of God will calm our anxiousness – Seek it out – Dust it off - You won't be sorry you did this! In the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit: Amen!

# History and Other News

## Memories of Hoge Memorial - by Nancy Loik

I learned my numbers before I went to school. Dad taught me to play poker when I was about 5 years old.

I also sat in on mom's teacher friends conversations. They were frank and open about sex, babies, etc. because of some of the kids at the Institution. I would listen and remember, then ask "Is this to be told?" I got into trouble once when Aunt Laura, their principal, Mrs. Grist, and others were visiting. Mrs. Grist asked how Doris was and I pipped up, "she doesn't drink anymore,." Mom and other howled but Aunt Laura was mortified. All the teachers smoked but not in front of Mrs. Grist. So the restrooms reeked of smoke.

I was with older people more (than most my age) so I was most comfortable with them (except close friends). I was just about always the youngest in the family except for Richard, Jane (on year younger and if anything, more spoiled), and Donald. I never baby sat until I was 16, then just once on New Years Eve.

When mom worked and I didn't have school, she would take me with her. I was treated just like the rest of the class. I went back 2 nights a week with her to dance with the kids. I was a black girl that taught me to dance. It is hard to explain that part of my childhood. There were bonds (built). Just last year I went to the funeral of one of mom's students. She was my age. She'd kept in touch with mom and me. She said after mom died, I was the only one that knew she'd been there (at the school) except her family.

(On this page in the journal were a couple of photos:) When I was in 4<sup>th</sup> grade and coming home from school I hers a huge explosion. It was the State Office Building. Three or four workers were killed. It was being built then (at the time).

A BIT OF A SMILE: A drunk man who smelled like beer sat down on a subway seat next to a priest. The man's tie was stained, his face was plastered with red lipstick, and a half empty bottle of gin was sticking out of his torn coat pocket. He opened his newspaper and began reading. After a few minutes the man turned to the priest and asked, "Say, Father, what causes arthritis?" **Financial Update – February 29, 2020** The following is a summary of Hoge’s 2020 financial activity through February. Detailed financial reports are available by request to the church office.

**Designated Offerings / Donations / Other Income during 2020:**

Ed & Lois Sensenbrenner Pastoral Care & Leadership Fund: \$124.66 (includes interest earned from designated savings account)

HM3 / Personal Care Pantry Support: \$3,206.17 (includes support from Covenant PC)

Parking Lot/Building Maintenance Fund: \$150.88 (includes interest earned from designated savings account)

Sound System Repairs/Replacement: \$500.00

**Financial notes:**

We continue to address maintenance needs of the building and property:


- We believe most of our plumbing challenges with our bathrooms have been addressed and repaired
- Parking lot lights have been repaired; arrangements for repairs to the light post on the east side are being made
- We are going to have tuck pointing done around our stained glass windows on the southeast side of the building; once this is taken care of, we can focus on repairing areas of peeling plaster & stucco inside the building
- We are continuing to seek quotes for repairs/replacements of our outside entry doors
- Our sound system is being further evaluated to determine if it can be repaired or needs replacement

We are currently able to address these much needed building/facility maintenance needs due to a generous donation of \$3,000.00 to Hoge at the end of 2019 and a commitment of funds from Covenant Presbyterian Church for \$10,000.00 in 2020. Hoge receives support from a variety of sources; those sources believe the work of Christ is present here and its impact to the community is true to our mission of *Feeding the Community, Physically & Spiritually*.

The Finance & Facilities committee appreciates your commitment to support Hoge with pledges of your time, talents and funds. Maintaining our building for worship, mission, safety, beauty and use in the community is something to be proud of. Contact members of the committee to inquire how you are able to help with any of these projects (physically and/or financially). Please continue to commit to Hoge in prayer, physical efforts, and financially. Thank you for your continued support. God is calling each of us to do our part to keep Hoge alive, providing mission and outreach to our community.

Clean kitchen sponge, dampen sponge, pop it in the microwave for 90 seconds on full power; Un-scratch plates make paste of baking soda and water, buff it into the scratches; Freshen up your mattress with baking soda, vacuum your mattress and apply baking soda to it. Make your blender clean itself, warm water, and baking soda, and a little dish soap in your blender, and pulsing it for a few seconds; Keep your washer smelling fresh with bleach, hot water and a quart of bleach; Never overload your dishwasher. Cramming everything into one load will result in dirtier dishes; Clean up your keyboard dip a toothbrush in a half vinegar/half water solution scrub both on and between those keyboard keys; Scrub a cast-iron skillet with a potato, pour coarse salt into your cast-iron pan and use half a potato to rub it in until that mess has broken up and can be rinsed away. Remove carpet stains mix vinegar and water in a 1:3 ratio, apply to stain, cover the stain with a wet cloth, steam for 30 seconds.
