August greetings my Brothers and Sisters in Christ! During June, I was on vacation in Asheville, NC with my family – We love the Asheville area, with the blue-ridge mountains, and The Pisgah National Forest with its scenic waterfalls.....We get away to recharge our internal batteries – To get out of our daily routines and reconnect with God and Jesus Christ. I hope you all have been doing well and maintaining your sanity as our country, state, and city continues to deal with the COVID 19 virus pandemic that has affected so many aspects of our daily lives. Your Session decided to reopen our in-person worship service as of June 14<sup>th</sup>, so we have returned to in-person Sunday worship at 10:30 here at Hoge! For those of you who aren't ready to come back physically to church, our worship and outreach committee decided to bring church to you – virtually, by taping our Sunday worship service at 10:30, then posting these services on our website, u-tube, and Facebook, so you can worship from the comfort of your home on Sundays. We're hopeful that we'll be taping our services by the end of July, so be looking for our announcement on having this available, and eventually, we will be live-streaming our 10:30 Sunday morning worship each Sunday, on U-Tube, our Website, and Facebook. During this pandemic, we have learned and come to embrace this virtual – Live worship experience that can be made available on the internet through a number of different formats – Hoge has been reaching our congregation locally through this virtual format, but we've also been reaching other Christians across the country who are identifying with our ministry here on the west side of Columbus by giving monetary donations to support our ministries! This is a huge blessing from God to see how our ministry is growing beyond our physical walls and gaining a following outside our natural geographic area. We must continue to embrace this new virtual technology which is expanding our ministry. We've also have a new employee to introduce to you! Our sexton of over 30 years, Tony Barnett, decided to retire, so we have a new sexton, Jim Cheadle, who started on June 29<sup>th</sup>. Please give Jim a warm welcome when you see him, and we are so blessed to have Jim be a part of our ministry here at Hoge! We've also been able to reopen our church to the many outside non-profit groups that use our facility each week, and are excited to have these groups back with us! We're also excited to announce that on Saturday, July 18<sup>th</sup>, we'll be reopening our HM3 Saturday evening worship service – to be held in our west parking lot as a mobile, to-go worship event, where the people will have a to-go meal, with a scripture passage, brief message, and hymn they can take with them for the week. This will allow us to get our HM3 worship service started again so we may serve the people on the hilltop who need us the most! As you can see, we're providing our friendly, uplifting ministry here at Hoge again, and do hope you are able to join us in-person soon again, and if not – look for us virtually on our website, U-Tube, or Facebook: Would you join me in prayer: All knowing and loving God, it's hard to believe that it's been 6 months since we displayed fresh calendars and entered a new decade – Never expecting we would be facing these unprecedented times of social distancing and stay-at-home orders. Just when it seems we can breathe a sigh of relief and see a return to normal, we are confronted again with even more uncertainty. For some of us, this is an inconvenience, and for others it's been a major adjustment, and we pray Lord for patience – while others wonder if they can survive and are struggling to meet their daily needs. We pray for provision – We pray for those lost loved-ones and for those that serve and work on the front-lines of this pandemic. As Pastors, we daily log on to ministry in this new, virtual-world, where we're learning to walk by faith and not by human sight, and we need you to lead us. God, we are learning more than ever of your transcendency as we experience church that spans space and time – We worship from phones, laptops, computers, and I-pads to zoom or Facebook or U-Tube into our beloved communities. 

**HM3 – SCRIPTURE AND MESSAGE – JULY 18, 2020**  
 Scripture: Read Psalm 25: 4-10: The Lord has said, “I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go.”  
 Recently, I was alone in my car driving home from a golf course way out in the country, when suddenly I wound up in a location I did not recognize – I had taken a wrong turn and was in an area totally unfamiliar to me. # Financial Update

## Financial Update – June 30, 2020

The following is a summary of Hoge’s 2020 financial activity through June. Detailed financial reports are available by request to the church office.

### Designated Offerings / Donations / Other Income during 2020:

Building Enhancement & Improvements Funds: \$25,020.55 (includes interest earned from designated savings account)

Deacons Funds: \$3,141.66 (includes support from Worthington PC)

Ed & Lois Sensenbrenner Pastoral Care & Leadership Fund: \$163.25 (includes interest earned from designated savings account)

HM3 / Personal Care Pantry Support: \$3,506.17 (includes support from Covenant PC & Westminster PC)

One Great Hour of Sharing: \$1,426.49

Parking Lot/Building Maintenance Fund: \$152.59 (includes interest earned from designated savings account)

Recycling: \$24.00

Sound System Repairs/Replacement: \$2,500.00

### Financial notes:

We continue to address maintenance needs of the building and property:

- We are still waiting for our west-side entry doors to arrive and be installed (they have been ordered)
- New handheld microphones, lavaliers, and receivers have been received and are being set up to be used in the sanctuary. Funds were donated to cover the cost of this purchase. Equipment needed to record and live-stream worship services has also been purchased. We will be pursuing a grant from Presbytery to help pay for some of this cost. As soon as we get trained on how to use the equipment, we will be able to record the services and post them onto our website, Facebook and U-Tube
- The Finance & Facilities committee are still discussing our most urgent needs and recommendations for efficient use of funds recently donated for building enhancements and improvements. If you have specific thoughts for maintenance needs of the church, please inform Janet Fetherolf or any member of the F&F committee

Hoge receives support from a variety of sources; those sources believe the work of Christ is present here and its impact to the community is true to our mission of *Feeding the Community, Physically & Spiritually*. Your consistent support is appreciated, especially during the challenging times of COVID-19. Life is starting to return to the building of Hoge. Groups have been meeting in our parking lot and are slowly moving back into the building.

The Finance & Facilities committee values your commitment to Hoge with time, talents and funds. Maintaining our building for worship, mission, safety, beauty and use in the community is something to be proud of. <p><b>Magic of baking soda - Keep cut flowers fresh</b> for longer a teaspoon of baking soda to the vase of water. <b>Make your pots and pans sparkle</b>, add 2 tablespoons to the pot, some water, simmer for 15 minutes. <b>Baking soda to everyday cooking</b>, put a pinch of baking soda in your tomato-based dishes, little bit of baking soda on small pieces of meat to tenderize then in fridge for an hour. <b>Freshen hands, chopping boards, cooking utensils</b> simply scrub with a little bit of baking soda, rinse. <b>Clean the fridge and odor-free</b> Make a paste of baking soda and water (3 parts baking soda to 1 part water) and clean the inside of your fridge, and/or, place a small container of baking soda inside the fridge. <b>Refresh dishcloths and sponges</b> 4 tablespoons of baking soda in 1 liter of warm water soak your dishcloths or sponges. (cont. for page 6) ½ tsp. crushed red pepper flakes, 1 celery stalk, finely chopped, 1 16-oz. can tomatoes, 1 8oz-can tomato sauce, ½ cup water, 3 cups long grain brown rice, cold, (2¼ cups rice and 2½ cups water makes 3 cups of cooked, rice), 1 cup low fat cottage cheese, 2 egg whites, 6 oz. part-skim mozzarella cheese, grated, ¼ cup freshly grated parmesan Heat the oil in a heavy or non-stick pan and sauté the onion and garlic until tender but not browned. Add the turkey and cook, stirring, until all pink has disappeared. Add oregano, basil, pepper flakes, celery, tomatoes, tomato sauce and water. Bring to a boil and simmer for 25 minutes. Combine cottage cheese, egg whites and mozzarella. Set aside. Mix turkey and tomato mixture. Layer in a 13x9 inch baking dish: turkey and tomato mixture, rice, cheese. Repeat for 2nd layer. Sprinkle with Parmesan and bake for 35 minutes at 350 degrees—Montgomery Presbyterian Church, Montgomery, Ohio
