

Financial notes:

Our plans for technology upgrades to the building continue to be underway. Chris Colborn and Lee Ninde are coordinating and leading this effort for Hoge. We continue to evaluate each of our administrative and operating expenses and making attempts to cut where possible. As mentioned at our congregational meeting in February, the hours of both the sexton and secretary were reduced beginning on February 19. Tony will continue to work Monday – Friday but at 5 hours per day and Paula will now work Tuesday and Wednesday (9:30 am - 2:30 pm), (Thursday, 9:30 am - 3:30 pm). Hours for both will be adjusted for holiday weeks as well.

The ministry and outreach occurring at Hoge can at times, feel overwhelming but in a wonderful sense of spiritual challenge and renewal. If you are not currently participating in any of the activities at Hoge, please prayerfully consider your willingness to do so. We have unique mission and outreach occurring here which is not happening anywhere else. You have to experience it to understand it!

God is calling each of us to do our part to keep Hoge alive, providing mission and outreach to our community. Please consider your prayerful, physical, and financial support during 2015 and for Hoge's future.
